

following sentence: — The hours of labor of nonprofessional employees in a nursing or convalescent home, or rest home, or charitable home for the aged shall not exceed forty-eight hours in any one week.

SECTION 2. Said first paragraph of said section 56 of said chapter 149 is hereby further amended by striking out the sentence inserted by section 1 of chapter 610 of the acts of 1941 and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: — The commissioner may grant authority for employees of hospitals to be employed for more than nine hours in one day and forty-eight hours in one week and outside of a period of ten consecutive hours, or for employees of nursing or convalescent homes, rest homes and charitable homes for the aged to be employed for more than forty-eight hours in one week, if he finds that an emergency exists.

Chap. 358. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF WARE TO PAY A SUM OF MONEY TO LEONARD D. AND ANGELINA MESSIER.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

For the purpose of discharging a moral obligation, the town of Ware may appropriate and pay to Leonard D. and Angelina Messier of said town, a sum not exceeding eight hundred and fifty dollars, for part of the expense incurred by them in installing and constructing a six inch water and sewer line with one manhole on Old Gilbertville road for a distance of two hundred feet.

Chap. 359. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF NORTH ATTLEBOROUGH TO USE CERTAIN PARK LAND IN SAID TOWN FOR THE TRANSMISSION OF ELECTRICITY BY ITS MUNICIPAL LIGHTING PLANT.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The town of North Attleborough is hereby authorized to erect and maintain poles and wires for an electric power line across and above the parcel of park land shown as "Parcel E-18, Easement Through Town Park" on a plan entitled "Plan of Land in North Attleborough, Mass., for Proposed Electric Plant Expansion Program, Sub-Station and Supply Line East Side to Whiting Street, Sheets 1, 2 and 3 of 3, Scale 1"-200 ft., dated 11-25-66, James E. Freeman, C.E." which plan is on file with the North Attleborough town clerk.

Chap. 360. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BOSTON TO PENSION SIGMUND A. GURSKI.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. For the purpose of promoting the public good, the fire commissioner of the city of Boston, with the approval of the Mayor of said city, shall forthwith retire, on an annual pension to be paid by said city in monthly instalments, Sigmund A. Gurski, a fire fighter in the fire department of said city, who is totally incapacitated as a result of a fracture of the skull and other injuries sustained by him when on September tenth, nineteen hundred and sixty-five he was thrown to

the ground at Massachusetts Avenue and Albany Street in Boston from fire apparatus responding to an alarm. Such pension shall be equal to the annual rate of regular compensation which would have been paid to him had he continued in service in the grade held by him at the time of his retirement. Upon his death leaving Catherine Gurski, his wife, surviving him, said city shall pay to her, so long as she remains unmarried, an annuity of fifteen hundred dollars a year.

SECTION 2. Upon the retirement of said Sigmund A. Gurski under this act, the Boston retirement board shall forthwith pay to him all amounts standing to his credit in the annuity savings fund of the State-Boston retirement system.

SECTION 3. The provisions of section one hundred of chapter forty-one of the General Laws shall continue to apply to said Sigmund A. Gurski to enable said city to indemnify him for reasonable hospital, medical and related expenses which may be incurred by him after the date of his retirement as a result of his aforementioned incapacity.

Chap. 361. AN ACT DESIGNATING THE FIRST DAY OF JULY IN THE CURRENT YEAR AS CANADA CENTENNIAL DAY AND PROVIDING THAT PUBLIC OFFICES SHALL BE CLOSED ON SAID DAY.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to provide forthwith for the designation of the first day of July in the current year as Canada Centennial Day and the closing of public offices on said day, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The first day of July in the current year is hereby designated as Canada Centennial Day, in honor of the one hundredth anniversary of the formation of the Dominion of Canada. The public offices shall be closed on said day.

Chap. 362. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF WORCESTER TO PAY CERTAIN SUMS OF MONEY TO PETER A. LEVENSON FOR CERTAIN SERVICES RENDERED AS A TEACHER IN SAID CITY.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the city of Worcester is hereby authorized to pay Peter A. Levenson such sums as may be due him for services rendered by him as a teacher in the school department of said city from September, nineteen hundred and sixty-five to December, nineteen hundred and sixty-five, not exceeding, in the aggregate, one hundred and ninety-seven dollars and eighty-six cents.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by the city of Worcester.
