## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-One.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ELECTION OF ASSESSORS IN  
THE CITY OF SOMERVILLE AND DEFINING THEIR POWERS  
AND DUTIES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. At the biennial municipal election to  
2 be held in the city of Somerville in the year nineteen  
3 hundred and forty-one, there shall be elected three  
4 assessors, one for the term of two years and two for  
5 terms of four years each. At each municipal election  
6 thereafter successors to the assessors to be elected  
7 thereat shall be elected for four years. The salary  
8 of each assessor shall be four thousand dollars. The  
9 term of each assessor shall commence on the first  
10 Monday of January following his election.

1 SECTION 2. The assessors elected as provided in  
2 this act shall exercise the powers and be subject to  
3 the liabilities and duties heretofore vested in the board  
4 of assessors of said city, and shall devote their full  
5 time to the duties of their office.

1 SECTION 3. The terms of office of all assessors of  
2 said city in office on December thirty-first, nineteen  
3 hundred and forty-one, shall terminate upon the quali-  
4 fication of the assessors elected as aforesaid at the  
5 municipal election in the year nineteen hundred and  
6 forty-one.

1 SECTION 4. Such provisions of chapter two hun-  
2 dred and forty of the acts of eighteen hundred and  
3 ninety-nine and acts in amendment thereof or in ad-  
4 dition thereto, as are inconsistent with this act are  
5 hereby repealed.
