## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Eight.

### AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COMMISSIONER OF NATURAL RESOURCES TO ACQUIRE CERTAIN LAND IN GREAT BARRINGTON.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The commissioner of natural resources, acting in  
2 behalf of the commonwealth, is hereby authorized and directed  
3 to acquire by gift, purchase or otherwise, or with the approval of  
4 the governor and council, to take by eminent domain, under the  
5 provisions of chapter seventy-nine of the General Laws for con-  
6 servation and recreational purposes, a certain parcel of land  
7 with the buildings, facilities and equipment thereon in Great  
8 Barrington, adjoining the East Mountain state forest, comprising  
9 approximately one hundred acres of land and water, known as  
10 the G-Bar-S Ranch.

1 SECTION 2. For the purposes of this act there may be ex-  
2 pended by the department of natural resources a sum not in  
3 excess of thirty-three thousand dollars, which may be appro-  
4 priated therefor.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I - Section 1 - All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2 - The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.

Section 3 - The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for a Term of six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.

Section 4 - The Times, Places and Manner of holding the Elections of Senators and Representatives, shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof; but the Congress may at any time by Law alter the Regulations relating thereto.

Section 5 - The Congress shall assemble at least once in every Year, and such Meeting shall begin on the first Monday in December, but they may adjourn from time to time, and may change the Day of the Meeting.

Section 6 - The Senators and Representatives shall receive a Compensation for their Services, which shall be ascertained from Time to Time by the Congress.

Section 7 - All bills for raising Revenue shall originate in the House of Representatives; but the Senate may propose or concur with Amendments as to the Form of such Bills.

Section 8 - The Congress shall have the following Powers: - To lay and collect Taxes, Duties, Imposts and Excises, to regulate Commerce with foreign Nations, among the several States, and with the Indian Tribes; to borrow Money on the credit of the United States; to regulate the Value of Money, the Weight and Measure, to define and punish the Counterfeiting of Money, to coin Money, to regulate the Bankruptcy and Insolvency Laws, to regulate the Naturalization and Immigration Laws, to exercise the exclusive Privilege of the Writ of Habeas Corpus, to regulate the Post Office and Post Roads, to establish Post Offices and Post Roads, to grant Letters of Marque and Reprisal, to grant Patents and Copyrights, to promote the Progress of Science and useful Arts, by securing for limited Times to Authors and Inventors the exclusive Right to their respective Writings and Discoveries; to constitute Tribes of inferior Courts, to define and punish the Offences against the Law of Nations, and define and punish Offences against the Law of War; to define and punish Offences committed on the high Seas, and Offences committed within the Jurisdiction of the United States; to declare War, to grant Letters of Marque and Reprisal, and to make Rules concerning the Capture of on the high Seas; to raise and support Armies, but no Appropriation of Money for that Purpose shall be for a longer Term than two Years; to raise and support the Navy; to make and fix the Standard of Weights and Measures; to exercise the Power of Impeachment; to provide for the Punishment of defaulters from the Service of the United States; to organize and regulate the Militia, to provide for calling them into the actual Service of the United States, to provide for the Government and Regulation of the Militia, to provide for the Organization, Armament and Discipline of the Militia to execute the Laws of the United States, and to provide for the Government and Regulation of the Militia to execute the Laws of the United States.

Section 9 - The Migration or Importation of Persons, other than free Persons already bound to Service, within the United States, shall not be Prohibited by any Law of Congress before the Year 1808, but the Tax or Duty thereon shall not exceed Ten Dollars for each Person.

Section 10 - No State shall enter into any Treaty, Alliance, or Confederation with another State, or with a foreign Power; nor shall they engage in War, unless actually invaded, or in such imminent Danger as will not admit of Delay.

Section 11 - The President and Vice President shall be chosen in the following Manner: - In each State there shall be one Elector, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.

Section 12 - The Electors shall meet in one or more States, and shall vote for President and Vice President, and the Votes shall be given by Ballot.

Section 13 - The Electors shall vote for two Persons, one of whom shall be qualified for the Office of President, and the other for the Office of Vice President, and the Name of one of the Persons so chosen shall be written on the Ballot, and the Name of the other shall be written on a separate Ballot.

Section 14 - The Electors shall vote for President and Vice President, and the Votes shall be given by Ballot.
