### AN ACT TO COMPENSATE JUSTICES FOR PERSONAL INJURIES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 211B of the General Laws, as most recently amended by  
2 Chapter 105 of the Acts of 1980, is further amended by inserting  
3 the following new section: —

4 *Section 15B.* A Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court, the Ap-  
5 peals Court, the Superior Court, the Housing Court, the Land  
6 Court, the Probate and Family Court, the Boston Municipal  
7 Court, the Juvenile Court, and the District Court including special  
8 justices, who receives a personal injury while in the performance of  
9 his duties which shall include an ordinary risk of the street, the  
10 operation and use of a motor vehicle and other incidental acts  
11 during a period of assignment after departing his residence shall  
12 receive regular compensation provided under law, together with  
13 medical expenses during any period of incapacity related thereto,  
14 without any deduction of a benefit to which he may otherwise be  
15 entitled, subject to approval and appropriate supervision includ-  
16 ing medical examination if same be deemed required by the Chief  
17 Administrative Judge or Chief Justice of the respective court or  
18 department, provided such salary be discontinued upon perman-  
19 ent retirement.
