AN ACT RELATIVE TO PAYMENT OF PENSIONS OF CERTAIN PROBATION OFFICERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking
2 out section 76A, as amended by chapter 757 of the acts of 1960,
3 and inserting in place thereof the following section:—

4 *Section 76A.* Any person retired under the provisions of
5 section seventy-five shall receive an annual pension equal to
6 one half of the regular annual compensation received by him at
7 the time of his retirement; provided, that any such person who
8 is retired after attaining age sixty-five and has faithfully per-
9 formed the duties of the office of probation officer during a period
10 of not less than twenty consecutive years immediately preceding
11 his retirement shall receive an annual pension equal to one half
12 of the regular annual compensation received by him at the time
13 of his retirement and an additional yearly amount equal to one
14 per cent of said compensation for each year after the first twenty,
15 the total yearly amount of his pension not to exceed sixty-five
16 per cent of said regular annual compensation or six thousand
17 dollars, whichever is less. Such pension shall be paid by the
18 county in which such person has performed his duties, or if he
19 has performed such duties in more than one county, it shall be
20 apportioned by the superior court among such counties.
