### AN ACT ABOLISHING THE CRIME OF ABORTION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Sections nineteen, twenty and twenty-one of  
2 chapter two hundred and seventy-two of the General Laws are  
3 hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 2. Section 79 of chapter 277 of the General Laws is  
2 hereby amended by striking out the form of complaint or  
3 indictment for "Abortion".
