

By Mr. Mannering of Boston, petition of Vincent G. Mannering for an appropriation of a certain sum of money for the expansion of curbside recycling in the city of Boston. Ways and Means (House).

AN ACT EXPANDING CURBSIDE RECYCLING IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 2 of Chapter 110 of the acts of 1993, as amended by
- 2 section 85 of Chapter 151 of the acts of 1993, is hereby amended
- 3 by striking out item 2010-0100 and inserting in place thereof the
- 4 following item: —

2010-0100	For the recycling coordination program for the operation of the Springfield recycling facility and to promote recycling activities in the commonwealth; provided, that not less than two million dollars shall be expended for the operational costs incurred by the city of Boston for the expansion of curbside recycling in the city of Boston; provided further, that not less than one hundred thousand dollars shall be expended for a public education campaign encouraging participation in existing curbside pick-up recycling programs in the city of Boston	3,950,000
	Clean Environment Fund.....	100.0%.

It is the duty of the House to inquire into the conduct of the Executive and to report thereon to the Senate. It is also the duty of the House to impeach and to try the President, Judges, and other Officers of the United States.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I, Section 5. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive Power of Impeachment. The House of Representatives shall have the sole and exclusive Power of Impeachment, and to try all Impeachments. When sitting for that Purpose, they shall be on Oath or Affirmation.

Article II, Section 4. The President, Judges, and other Officers of the United States shall be liable to Impeachment and Trial, for and Convicted of Treason, Bribery, or other high Crimes and Misdemeanors.

Article III, Section 2. The judicial Power shall extend to all Cases in Law and Equity, arising under this Constitution, the Laws of the United States, and Treaties made, or which shall be made, under the Authority of the United States.

Article IV, Section 1. Full Faith and Credit shall be given in each State to the public Acts, Records, and judicial Proceedings of every other State. The States shall also give full Faith and Credit to the public Acts, Records, and judicial Proceedings of the United States.

Article V. The Congress, whenever two thirds of both Houses shall so require, shall propose Amendments to this Constitution, which shall take Effect as part of this Constitution when ratified by the Legislatures of three fourths of the several States, or by Conventions in three fourths thereof, which Conventions may be called by the Congress, or by the Legislatures of two thirds of the several States.
