## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Three.

### AN ACT REQUIRING AUTO INSURANCE COMPANIES TO TOTAL AUTO PREMIUMS TO THE REGISTRY OF MOTOR VEHICLES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 That automobile insurance companies be required to furnish  
2 the Registrar of Motor Vehicles the territory and the classifica-  
3 tion of each automobile and the amount of the total premium  
4 rate charged for personal injury protection insurance and the  
5 total premium rate charged for property protection insurance for  
6 each insured.

7 The Registrar shall collect and collate said information by  
8 territory and by classification, including the total premium paid  
9 for each territory and classification, and report said information  
10 twice yearly to the Commissioner of Insurance to assist in the  
11 determination of the insurance rates.
