AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF AN ADDITIONAL JUSTICE
IN THE PROBATE AND FAMILY COURT DEPARTMENT OF THE TRIAL
COURT IN THE WORCESTER COUNTY DIVISION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 2 of chapter 217 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by striking out the first sentence, as most recently amended by
3 chapter 741 of the acts of 1979, and inserting in place thereof the
4 following sentence: — There shall be four judges of probate in the
5 county of Middlesex, three judges of probate in each of the coun-
6 ties of Suffolk, Norfolk, Plymouth and Worcester, and two judges
7 of probate in each of the counties of Essex, Hampden and Bristol.
