AN ACT RELATIVE TO COMPENSATION FOR OVERTIME SERVICE BY MEMBERS OF THE DETECTIVE BRANCH OF THE DIVISION OF STATE POLICE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 22 of the General Laws is hereby amended by strik-
2 ing out section 9I, inserted by chapter 548 of the acts of 1956,
3 and inserting in place thereof the following section:—
4 *Section 9I.* Notwithstanding the provisions of any law to
5 the contrary, the services of all members of the detective
6 branch of the division of state police shall be restricted to five
7 days and to forty hours in any one week; provided, that service
8 in excess of the aforesaid days and hours may be authorized by
9 the commissioner and members of the detective branch of the
10 division of state police who perform service beyond their regu-
11 lar hours of service shall be compensated therefor as overtime
12 service, at an hourly rate equal to one and one-half times the
13 hourly rate of their regular compensation for their average
14 weekly hours of regular duty.
