

HOUSE No. 4710

By Mr. O'Brien of Fall River, petition of Patrick H. Harrington that the county treasurer of Bristol County be authorized to pay a sum of money to Regal Floor Covering, Inc., for labor and materials at the Taunton Superior Courthouse, Counties.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY TREASURER OF BRISTOL COUNTY TO PAY A SUM OF MONEY TO REGAL FLOOR COVERING, INC.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of sec-
2 tion seventeen of chapter thirty-four of the General Laws, the
3 county treasurer of Bristol county is hereby authorized to pay
4 to Regal Floor Covering, Inc., the sum of two thousand and
5 three hundred and fifty dollars from money being held in reserve
6 for a contract for payment for labor and material involved in
7 the installation of linoleum in the Taunton superior courthouse
8 during the year nineteen hundred and sixty-seven.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by
2 the county commissioners of Bristol county.

By the House on 11th May 1870, the following resolution was adopted:—
Resolved, That the Committee on the subject of the proposed
amendment to the Constitution be authorized to report thereon as early as possible.

The Constitution of the Commonwealth

As amended by the Convention of 1870.

The following is a copy of the Constitution of the Commonwealth, as amended by the Convention of 1870, and as it now stands.

It is enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the laws relating to the revision of the Constitution, that the following be the Constitution of the Commonwealth:

- Section 1. The Executive Power shall be vested in the Governor.
- Section 2. The Governor shall hold his office for a term of four years, and shall be eligible for re-election.
- Section 3. The Governor shall have the honor and privilege of the robe, and shall be sworn before he enters on his office.
- Section 4. The Governor shall have the power to pardon and reprieve, and to commute the punishment of any crime, except treason and murder.
- Section 5. The Governor shall have the power to grant reprieves and commutations of punishment, and to pardon and remit all offences against the laws of the Commonwealth.
- Section 6. The Governor shall have the power to grant pardons and commutations of punishment, and to remit all offences against the laws of the Commonwealth.
