By Mr. Lionett of Worcester, petition of David J. Lionett and John J. Conte relative to requiring the appointment of a student member to the advisory board of each regional community college. Education.

AN ACT REQUIRING THE APPOINTMENT OF A STUDENT MEMBER TO THE ADVISORY BOARD OF A REGIONAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 15 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out section 38, added by section 1 of
3 chapter 737 of the acts of 1964, and inserting in place thereof
4 the following section: —

5 *Section 38.* Each regional community college established
6 under section twenty-eight shall have an advisory board to
7 consist of members appointed by the governor. The members
8 shall be residents of the region served by the college. In the
9 initial appointments, two members shall be appointed to serve
10 for five years, two for four years, two for three years, two for
11 two years, and two for one year. Upon the expiration of the
12 term of a member of an advisory board his successor shall be
13 appointed for a term of five years. At least one member of
14 each advisory board shall be a representative of business, one
15 shall be a representative of labor, and one shall be a student
16 attending such college.

1 SECTION 2. The student member appointed under section
2 one of this act shall serve for a term of one year.
