

HOUSE No. 472

Bill accompanying the petition of Richard K. Conant for legislation relative to the employment of persons under twenty-one years of age in the night messenger service. Labor. January 13.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eleven.

AN ACT

Relative to Employment in the Night Messenger Service.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. No person under the age of twenty-one
2 years shall be employed or permitted to work as a mes-
3 senger for a telegraph or messenger company in the dis-
4 tribution, transmission or delivery of goods or messages
5 before five o'clock in the morning or after ten o'clock in
6 the evening of any day.

1 SECTION 2. Whoever employs a person under the age
2 of twenty-one years, or whoever procures or having under
3 his control any such person permits him to be employed in
4 violation of the provisions of section one of this act, shall
5 for each offense be punished by a fine of not less than fifty
6 nor more than three hundred dollars or by imprisonment
7 for not more than six months or by both such fine and
8 imprisonment.

1 SECTION 3. The district police shall enforce the pro-
2 visions of this act.
