### AN ACT

In Still Further Addition to the Several Acts making Appropriations for Sundry Miscellaneous Expenses authorized during the Present Year and for Certain Miscellaneous Expenses authorized by Law.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are ap-  
2 propriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the com-  
3 monwealth from the ordinary revenue, unless herein  
4 otherwise provided, for the purposes specified, to wit:—

5 For expenses of the harbor and land commission in  
6 constructing a sea wall or other structure in the town of  
7 Hull, as authorized by chapter seven hundred and one of  
8 the acts of the present year, a sum not exceeding twenty-  
9 five thousand dollars.

10 For clerical and other expenses of the commission ap-  
11 pointed to provide for suitably rewarding certain veteran  
12 soldiers and sailors, as authorized by chapter seven hun-  
13 dred and two of the acts of the present year, a sum not  
14 exceeding two thousand dollars.

15 For the construction or improvement of the highway  
16 between the towns of Ware and West Brookfield, as au-  
17 thorized by chapter seven hundred and three of the acts  
18 of the present year, a sum not exceeding ten thousand  
19 dollars.

20 For salaries and expenses of the minimum wage com-  
21 mission, as authorized by chapter seven hundred and six  
22 of the acts of the present year, a sum not exceeding five  
23 thousand dollars.

24 For an investigation of the development of the Mer-  
25 rimac river, as authorized by chapter seven hundred and  
26 eight of the acts of the present year, a sum not exceeding  
27 ten thousand dollars.

28 For expenses of the homestead commission, as author-  
29 ized by chapter seven hundred and fourteen of the acts  
30 of the present year, a sum not exceeding two thousand  
31 dollars.

32 For maintenance expenses of the Salisbury beach res-  
33 ervation district, as authorized by chapter seven hundred  
34 and fifteen of the acts of the present year, a sum not  
35 exceeding five thousand dollars, the same to be assessed  
36 upon the cities and towns composing said district.

37 For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of chap-  
38 ters seven hundred and sixteen and seven hundred and  
39 seventeen relative to the taking by the commonwealth of  
40 the Newburyport bridge and the bridge over Taunton  
41 Great river, a sum not exceeding eighty-seven thousand  
42 dollars.

43 For salaries and expenses of the commission on econ-  
44 omy and efficiency, as authorized by chapter seven hun-  
45 dred and nineteen of the acts of the present year, a sum  
46 not exceeding fourteen thousand two hundred and fifty  
47 dollars.

48 For new furniture and fixtures, a sum not exceeding

49 six thousand dollars, the same to be in addition to any  
50 amounts heretofore appropriated for this purpose.

51 For incidentals in the office of the auditor of the com-  
52 monwealth, a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars, the  
53 same to be in addition to any amount heretofore appro-  
54 priated for this purpose.

55 For expenses of the inspection of the cold storage of  
56 food, as authorized by chapter six hundred and fifty-two  
57 of the acts of the present year, a sum not exceeding fif-  
58 teen hundred dollars.

59 For improvements in the heating, ventilating and  
60 power plant of the state house, as authorized by chapter  
61 one hundred and thirty-nine of the resolves of the pres-  
62 ent year, a sum not exceeding forty thousand dollars.

63 For increasing the quantity of food fish produced in  
64 public waters, as authorized by chapter one hundred and  
65 forty of the resolves of the present year, a sum not ex-  
66 ceeding five thousand dollars.

67 To provide for certain improvements at The Bradford  
68 Durfee Textile School of Fall River, as authorized by  
69 chapter one hundred and forty-one of the resolves of the  
70 present year, a sum not exceeding twenty-two thousand  
71 dollars.

72 For the New Bedford textile school, as authorized by  
73 chapter one hundred and forty-two of the resolves of the  
74 present year, the sum of twenty thousand dollars.

75 To provide for the representation of Massachusetts at  
76 the Panama-Pacific International Exposition, as author-  
77 ized by chapter one hundred and forty-four of the re-  
78 solves of the present year, a sum not exceeding fifteen  
79 thousand dollars.

80 For additional compensation for the commission ap-  
81 pointed to report a plan for compensating workmen for  
82 injuries, as authorized by chapter one hundred and

83 forty-five of the resolves of the present year, a sum not  
84 exceeding six thousand dollars.

85 To provide for printing and distributing maps show-  
86 ing the division of the commonwealth into congressional  
87 districts, as authorized by chapter one hundred and forty-  
88 six of the resolves of the present year, a sum not exceed-  
89 ing six hundred dollars.

90 For expenses of the investigation by the Connecticut  
91 Valley Waterways Board, as authorized by chapter one  
92 hundred and forty-nine of the resolves of the present  
93 year, a sum not exceeding twenty-five hundred dollars.

94 For expenses of the commission on state house in mak-  
95 ing an investigation as to the advisability of constructing  
96 an office building, as authorized by chapter one hundred  
97 and fifty of the resolves of the present year, a sum not  
98 exceeding five thousand dollars.

99 For salary of the first deputy in the department of the  
100 auditor of the commonwealth, a sum not exceeding two  
101 hundred and fifty dollars, the same to be in addition to  
102 the amount heretofore appropriated for the purpose.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
