AN ACT PROHIBITING DISCLOSURE OF CERTAIN POLICE PERSONNEL RECORDS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 99A of Chapter 41 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by adding the following new sentences at the end
3 thereof: — The city or town residences of all civil service
4 employees shall be a public record available to the public during
5 regular business hours and at other reasonable times. The home
6 street address or home telephone number of police officers as
7 maintained by police departments or personnel offices shall not
8 be subject to the mandatory disclosure provisions of section ten A
9 of Chapter sixty-six of the General Laws.
