**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Five.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT PATRIOTS DAY BE CELEBRATED FOR THREE DAYS IN THE YEAR NINETEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Patriots day shall be celebrated as a legal holiday on April  
2 nineteenth, twentieth and twenty-first in the year nineteen  
3 hundred and seventy-five; provided, however, that the  
4 provisions of sections five to eleven, inclusive, of chapter one  
5 hundred and thirty-six of the General Laws shall not apply to  
6 any of said days, except Sunday, April 21st.
