AN ACT

Making an Appropriation for the Maintenance of the Industrial School for Boys.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. A sum not exceeding forty-eight thousand
2 one hundred and fifty dollars is hereby appropriated, to
3 be paid out of the treasury of the commonwealth, from the
4 ordinary revenue, for the maintenance of the industrial
5 school for boys for the fiscal year ending on the thirtieth
6 day of November, nineteen hundred and eleven. (Acts
7 1908, ch. 639.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$48,550.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
