### AN ACT TO PROTECT SAFETY OF EMPLOYEES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 141 of chapter 149 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by adding the following new paragraph:—
- 3 Every person operating a factory, shop or mechanical es-
- 4 tablishment where machinery is used and where more than one
- 5 hundred employees are employed shall also maintain a doctor
- 6 or qualified medical aid person on the plant premises at all times
- 7 when one hundred or more persons are employed. Whoever
- 8 violates this paragraph shall be punished by a fine of not less
- 9 than fifty nor more than five hundred dollars for every week
- 10 during which such violation continues.
