AN ACT CONSOLIDATING THE SECOND DISTRICT COURT OF ESSEX INTO THE DISTRICT COURT OF NEWBURYPORT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1 of Chapter 218 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by Chapter 478 of the Acts of 1978, is hereby further
3 amended by striking out all under the caption "Essex" and insert-
4 ing in place thereof the following:—

5 ESSEX.

6 The first district court of Essex held at Salem; Salem, Beverly,
7 Danvers, Hamilton, Middleton, Topsfield, Wenham and Man-
8 chester.

9 The third district court of Essex held at Ipswich; Ipswich.

10 The central district court of Northern Essex, held at Haverhill;
11 Haverhill, Groveland, Georgetown, Boxford and West Newbury;
12 the district court of Newburyport exercising concurrent jurisdic-
13 tion in West Newbury.

14 The district court of eastern Essex, held at Gloucester; Glouces-
15 ter, Rockport and Essex.

16 The district court of southern Essex, held at Lynn; Lynn,
17 Swampscott, Saugus, Marblehead and Nahant.

18 The district court of Lawrence, held at Lawrence and Methuen;
19 Lawrence, Andover, North Andover and Methuen.

20 The district court of Newburyport, held at Newburyport; Ames-
21 bury, Merrimac, Newburyport, Newbury, Rowley, Salisbury and
22 West Newbury; the central district court of northern Essex exercis-
23 ing concurrent jurisdiction in West Newbury.

24 The district court of Peabody, held at Peabody; Peabody and
25 Lynnfield.
