AN ACT AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE TREASURER OF THE COMMONWEALTH TO PAY A SUM OF MONEY TO WILLIAM B. MEISNER.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of discharging a moral
2 obligation of the commonwealth, the treasurer of the
3 commonwealth is authorized and directed to pay the
4 sum of ten thousand dollars to William B. Meisner of
5 Braintree to compensate him for expenses of the hospital
6 and medical care, and for his pain and suffering due to
7 injuries received by him while he was a patient at the
8 Lemuel Shattuck Hospital.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

It is the duty of the House to inquire into the conduct of the President in the exercise of his powers, and to report thereon to the Senate for its consideration. It is the duty of the Senate to advise and consent to the appointment and removal of the President's officers, and to advise and consent to the ratification of the President's treaties.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA: AS AMENDED BY THE THIRTEENTH, FOURTEENTH, FIFTEENTH, AND NINETEENTH AMENDMENTS.
