Kirby and Peter Forman relative to the sale of manufactured homes, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 6361) ought to be adopted.

Ordered, That the committee on Commerce and Labor be authorized to sit during the recess of the General Court for the purpose of making an investigation and study of the subject matter of current House documents numbered: — 4335, legislation to change commission name to manufactured home commission; 4336, legislation regarding the transfer of mobile home park licenses; 4337, legislation to alter the definition of “mobile home park”; 4867, legislation to alter the definition of “manufactured home”; 4868, legislation to exempt mobile home dealer inventory from license fees; 4869, legislation to require the issuance of manufactured home certificates of ownership; 4870, legislation to provide for the classification of manufactured homes as personal property; and 4872, legislation to prohibit certain solicitations of sales of mobile homes.

Said committee shall be provided with quarters in the State House or elsewhere, may hold public hearings, may travel within the Commonwealth, and may expend for clerical and other services and expenses such sums as may be appropriated therefor. Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect by filing the same with the Clerk of the House on or before the first Wednesday in December, nineteen hundred and eighty-three.
