Casey relative to the printing of the name and address of the next of kin or health care proxy on driver's licenses, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3481) of John P. Fresolo and John J. Binienda relative to minimum age requirement for obtaining identification cards, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3505) of Denis E. Guyer and others that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be authorized to issue farmer general registration number plates, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3567) of Paul J. P. Loscocco relative to the registration and inspection off street rods and custom vehicles, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3618) of Mary S. Rogeness and Alice Hanlon Peisch for legislation to require persons seventy years of age and older to appear in person for motor vehicle license renewals, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3651) of A. Stephen Tobin relative to the issuance of hardship motor vehicle licenses and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3668) of James E. Vallee and Paul J. P. Loscocco for legislation to exempt persons sixty-five years of age or older from motor vehicle registration or licensee fees, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 4620) ought to be adopted.
