The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-One.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO APPOINT CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION TO POSITIONS IN THE WATER SERVICE OF SAID METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The metropolitan district commission is hereby
2 authorized to appoint, as hereinafter provided, to
3 positions in the service of the metropolitan water
4 district, not more than fifteen employees of the met-
5 ropolitan district water supply commission, estab-
6 lished by chapter three hundred and seventy-five of
7 the acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-six, who
8 have been employed by the said metropolitan district
9 water supply commission, and are so employed on the
10 effective date of this act, in the construction of works
11 extending and increasing the water supply of the
12 metropolitan water system. No person shall be ap-

13 pointed hereunder unless the said metropolitan dis-
14 trict commission shall determine that such person
15 has held a responsible position in such construction
16 work, and by reason of such employment is especially
17 fitted by training and experience to fill the position
18 to which he is so appointed. Each person so ap-
19 pointed shall be subjected to a non-competitive quali-
20 fying examination for such position by the division of
21 civil service of the department of civil service and
22 registration. If such an appointee passes said exami-
23 nation, he shall be certified for said position and shall
24 be deemed to be permanently appointed thereto with-
25 out serving any probationary period, and his tenure
26 of office shall be unlimited, subject, however, to the
27 provisions of said civil service laws.
