RESOLVE DISCHARGING A MORAL OBLIGATION OF THE COMMONWEALTH IN FAVOR OF JAMES E. CURRY.

1 *Resolved*, That for the purpose of discharging a moral ob-
2 ligation of the commonwealth, there shall be allowed and paid
3 out of the state treasury, subject to appropriation, to James E.
4 Curry, the sum of five thousand nine hundred and sixty-nine
5 dollars and eighty-two cents for legal expenses incurred in de-
6 fending himself in a criminal action based on charges arising out
7 of his conduct in his official duties in which he was acquitted
8 after trial in Suffolk superior court.
