AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE PERSONNEL ADMINISTRATOR TO CONTINUE THE EMPLOYMENT OF PROVISIONAL POLICE OFFICERS UNTIL THEIR REPLACEMENT HAS BEEN MADE FROM THE OFFICIAL CIVIL SERVICE POLICE LIST.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section twelve
2 and fourteen of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws, at the
3 request of the appointing authority, the personnel administrator is
4 hereby authorized to approve the employment of a person
5 appointed as provisional police officer by a city or town until such
6 time as a permanent appointment has been made from eligible lists
7 established for police services positions and a person so appointed
8 has completed the prescribed police training course, provided that
9 the appointing authority has complied with all instructions issued
10 by the director of civil service.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall become inoperative on December
2 thirty-first, nineteen hundred and eighty-five.
