

Chap.784 AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARIES OF THE MEMBERS OF THE APPELLATE TAX BOARD.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

G. L. (Ter. Ed.), 58A, § 1, etc., amended.

Appellate tax board, members, terms, salaries.

Section 1 of chapter 58A of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the first paragraph, as amended by chapter 583 of the acts of 1948, and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph: — There shall be in the department of corporations and taxation, but in no manner subject to the control of the commissioner of said department, an appellate tax board, in this chapter referred to as the board, consisting of five members appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, who shall be designated in their initial appointments to serve respectively for two, three, four, five and six years from March first in the year of appointment. The governor, with the advice and consent of the council, shall designate one of the members as chairman. Upon the expiration of the term of office of a member, his successor shall be appointed in the manner aforesaid for six years. The chairman of said board shall receive a salary of nine thousand dollars and each other member shall receive a salary of eighty-five hundred dollars. All members of the board shall devote their whole time in office hours to the work of the board.

Chap.785 AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARIES OF THE MEMBERS OF THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES CONTROL COMMISSION.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

G. L. (Ter. Ed.), 6, § 43, etc., amended.

Salaries.

Section 43 of chapter 6 of the General Laws, as amended by section 1 of chapter 375 of the acts of 1933, is hereby further amended by striking out the next to the last sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: — The chairman shall receive a salary of nine thousand dollars and each other member shall receive a salary of seventy-six hundred dollars per annum.

Chap.786 AN ACT ALLOWING CERTAIN PERSONS IN THE EMPLOY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION TO TAKE QUALIFYING EXAMINATIONS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The division of civil service is hereby authorized to allow the incumbents of the positions of boat captain, boatswain-engineer, and boatswain in the department of conservation, who were serving therein on July first, nineteen hundred and forty-nine, to take qualifying examinations for said positions. Upon passing such qualifying examinations said incumbents shall be deemed to be permanently employed in such positions, subject to the civil service laws.
