## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Four.

### AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF QUINCY TO SELL CERTAIN PARK LAND TO JOHN DELUCA.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The city of Quincy is hereby authorized to sell  
2 and convey to John DeLuca, of said city, upon such terms and  
3 conditions as may be determined by said city, a certain parcel  
4 of park land on North Street in said city, being shown as plot  
5 thirty-five on plan number 6074 of the city of Quincy.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by  
2 the city of Quincy.

The Commission of Government
