AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A FIFTH ASSISTANT CLERK IN THE MUNICIPAL COURT OF THE ROXBURY DISTRICT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 10 of chapter 218 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out the third paragraph, as appearing in
3 section 1 of chapter 309 of the acts of 1941, and inserting in
4 place thereof the following paragraph: —

5 A fourth assistant clerk and a fifth assistant clerk with salaries
6 payable by the county may be appointed in the municipal court
7 of the Roxbury district.
