AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE GIVING OF NOTICE TO SCHOOL  
TEACHERS AND SUPERINTENDENTS NOT SERVING AT  
DISCRETION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 Section 41 of chapter 71 of the General Laws is  
2 hereby amended by striking out the sentence added  
3 by chapter 283 of the acts of 1950 and inserting in  
4 place thereof the two following sentences:— When  
5 ever a teacher or superintendent not serving at dis-  
6 cretion is not to be employed for the following school  
7 year he shall be given a written notice, to be delivered  
8 to him on or before April fifteenth that he is not to  
9 be so employed. If any teacher or superintendent  
10 not serving at discretion fails to receive such notice,  
11 he shall be considered as having been elected for the  
12 following school year.
