AN ACT DIRECTING THE MASSACHUSETTS HISTORICAL COMMISSION TO CERTIFY ELM PARK IN THE CITY OF WORCESTER AS AN HISTORIC LANDMARK.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The Massachusetts historical commission is hereby author-
2 ized and directed to certify that the area in the city of Worces-
3 ter known as Elm Park, bounded by Park avenue, Elm street,
4 Russel street and Highland street, as an historic landmark as
5 provided in section twenty-seven of chapter nine of the Gen-
6 eral Laws, said land having been acquired by said city of
7 Worcester in the year eighteen hundred and fifty-four as the
8 first purchase of land in the United States set aside specifically
9 for a public park.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGULATION OF THE BUSINESS OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS IN THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty, as follows:

- 1 The Massachusetts Historical Commission is hereby created.
- 2 and it is directed to collect and preserve in this city of Worcester
- 3 the records of the State, founded by Peter Wenzel, the first
- 4 historical record of Highland street, as an historic landmark, as
- 5 provided in section twenty-seven of chapter nine of the laws
- 6 and laws, and said building has acquired by said city of
- 7 Worcester in the year eighteen hundred and fifty four as the
- 8 first public building in the United States and said building
- 9 for a public park.
