### RESOLVE

Granting a Tax for the County of Norfolk.

1 *Resolved*, That the following sums are hereby appro-  
2 priated for the expenses of the county of Norfolk for the  
3 year nineteen hundred and fourteen:—

4 For interest on county debt, a sum not exceeding thir-  
5 teen thousand dollars.

6 For reduction of county debt, a sum not exceeding  
7 thirty-two thousand dollars.

8 For salaries of county officers and assistants, fixed by  
9 law, a sum not exceeding twenty-one thousand dollars.

10 For clerical assistance in county offices, a sum not ex-  
11 ceeding twenty-six thousand dollars.

12 For salaries and expenses of district and police courts,  
13 a sum not exceeding forty-one thousand dollars.

14 For salaries of jailers, masters and assistants, and sup-  
15 port of prisoners in jails and houses of correction, a sum  
16 not exceeding thirty-two thousand dollars.

17 For criminal costs in the superior court, a sum not ex-  
18 ceeding nineteen thousand dollars.

19 For civil expenses in the supreme judicial and superior  
20 courts, a sum not exceeding twenty-two thousand dollars.

21 For transportation expenses of county and associate  
22 commissioners, a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars.

23 For medical examiners, inquests and commitments of  
24 the insane, a sum not exceeding six thousand eight hun-  
25 dred dollars.

26 For auditors, masters and referees, a sum not exceeding  
27 three thousand five hundred dollars.

28 For repairing, furnishing and improving county build-  
29 ings, a sum not exceeding five thousand dollars.

30 For fuel, lights and supplies in county buildings other  
31 than jails and houses of correction, and for care of the  
32 same, a sum not exceeding twenty-eight thousand dollars.

33 For highways, including state highways, bridges and  
34 land damages, a sum not exceeding thirty-one thousand  
35 five hundred dollars.

36 For training school, a sum not exceeding four thousand  
37 dollars.

38 For pensions, a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars.

39 For miscellaneous and contingent expenses of the cur-  
40 rent year, a sum not exceeding three thousand six hun-  
41 dred ninety dollars and fifteen cents.

42 And the county commissioners of said county are hereby  
43 authorized to levy as the county tax of said county for  
44 the current year, in the manner provided by law, the sum  
45 of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, to be expended,  
46 together with the cash balance on hand and the receipts  
47 from other sources, for the above purposes.
