

By Mr. Lane of Holden, petition of the Massachusetts Association of School Superintendents and Harold M. Lane, Jr., relative to the Medical Security Trust Fund. Education, Arts and Humanities.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Five.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE MEDICAL SECURITY TRUST FUND.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to
2 the contrary, any amounts, including principal, interest and penal-
3 ties due to the medical security trust fund, established in chapter
4 one hundred and eighteen F of the General Laws, and owing from
5 any regional school district or educational collaborative pursuant
6 to section fourteen G of chapter one hundred and fifty-one A of
7 the General Laws as of the effective date of this act, are hereby
8 extinguished and the payment thereof excused. Nothing in this
9 section shall be construed to provide the basis for the refund
10 of payment made by any regional school district or education
11 collaborative to said fund prior to the effective date of this act.

By the House of Representatives, passed in the House on the 15th day of January, 1901, and reported to the Senate on the 17th day of January, 1901, with amendments.

THE COMMERCE AND NAVIGATION ACT
