AN ACT TO REDUCE THE FINANCIAL IMPACT OF PROLONGED HOSPITALIZATION FOR THE FAMILIES OF MENTALLY RETARDED PERSONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 96 of chapter 123 of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by adding at the end of the first paragraph
3 thereof the following sentences:—Total liability of the family
4 of a retarded child in full-time residency in a facility of the
5 Department of Mental Health shall cease for any period of
6 such full time residency in excess of five years. The liability of
7 a parent for such price of support for a child shall cease for
8 any period of full-time residency after the child reaches the
9 age of twenty-one.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
