By Mr. Moore of Uxbridge, petition of Richard T. Moore relative to the costs of vocational post-graduate students. Education.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Two.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE COSTS OF VOCATIONAL POST-GRADUATE STUDENTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 8 of chapter 74 of the General Laws, as  
2 most recently amended by chapter 730 of the acts of 1970, is hereby  
3 further amended by adding at the end thereof the following sen-  
4 tence: — No tuition shall be payable under this section by a town in  
5 respect of a student who has satisfactorily completed the twelfth  
6 grade or courses equivalent thereto.

1 SECTION 2. Said chapter 74 is hereby further amended by  
2 inserting after section 8A the following section: —

3 *Section 8B.* The commonwealth shall annually pay to towns or  
4 regional school districts, maintaining approved local or district  
5 regional school district independent distributive occupations, in-  
6 dustrial, agricultural, vocational home economics or allied health  
7 occupations, except agricultural departments in high schools, an  
8 amount equal to the operating expenditure for each attending  
9 student who has satisfactorily completed the twelfth grade or  
10 courses equivalent thereto.
