HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, June 1, 1983.

The committee on Government Regulations, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 369) of Mary Jeanette Murray and Thomas F. Brownell for legislation to prohibit the use of coin operated machines by the State Lottery Commission; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 372) of Mary Jeanette Murray relative to the apportionment of revenues from the State Lottery; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1664) of Thomas C. Norton relative to establishing a board of certification for energy auditors; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1974) of John C. McNeil relative to the apportionment of revenues from the State Lottery; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House No. 5699) of the Massachusetts Association of Electrologists for legislation to reduce the renewal fees for certain registered electrologists, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 6409) ought to be adopted.

Ordered. That the committee on Government Regulations be authorized to sit during the recess of the General Court for the purpose of making an investigation and study of the subject of the current House documents numbered: — 369, legislation prohibiting the use of coin operated machines by the State Lottery Commission; 372, legislation apportioning the revenues from the State Lottery; 1664, legislation establishing a board of certification for energy auditors; 1974, legislation relative to the apportionment of revenues of the State Lottery Commission; 5699, legislation to reduce the license renewal fees for retired registered electrologists, registered lecturers, and registered instructors to twenty-five percent of the annual license renewal fee.

Said committee shall be provided with quarters in the State House or elsewhere, may hold public hearings, may travel within the Commonwealth, and may expend for clerical and other services and expenses such sums as may be appropriated therefor. Said Committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of such legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect by filing the same with the clerk of the House on or before the first Wednesday of December, nineteen hundred and eighty-three.
