## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-two.

### AN ACT

#### Making Appropriations for Certain Educational Expenses.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned  
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury  
3 of the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,  
4 except as herein provided, to meet expenses for  
5 the year ending on the thirty-first day of Decem-  
6 ber, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-two,  
7 to wit:—

8 For the support of state normal schools, a  
9 sum not exceeding ninety-one thousand eight  
10 hundred and eighty-one dollars, to be paid out of  
11 the moiety of the income of the Massachusetts  
12 school fund applicable to educational purposes,  
13 and the excess, if any, from the treasury of the

14 Commonwealth. [Pub. Stat., chap. 43; Acts  
15 1858, chap. 96.]

(Appropriation 1891, \$79,540.)

16 For the support of the state normal art school,  
17 a sum not exceeding eighteen thousand three  
18 hundred and sixty dollars to be paid out of the  
19 moiety of the income of the Massachusetts school  
20 fund applicable to educational purposes, and the  
21 excess, if any, from the treasury of the Common-  
22 wealth. [Res. 1876; chap. 51; 1880, chap. 47;  
23 1883, chap. 31; Acts 1885, chap. 330.]

(Appropriation 1891, \$17,980.)

24 For expenses of teachers' institutes, a sum not  
25 exceeding two thousand dollars, to be paid out of  
26 moiety of the income of the Massachusetts school  
27 fund applicable to educational purposes. [Pub.  
28 Stat., chap. 42, sec. 2]

(Appropriation 1891, \$2,000.)

29 For expenses of county teachers' associations,  
30 a sum not exceeding three hundred dollars, to be  
31 paid out of the moiety of the income of the  
32 Massachusetts school fund applicable to educa-  
33 tional purposes. [Pub. Stat., chap. 42, sec. 4.]

(Appropriation 1891, \$300.)

34 For the Massachusetts teachers' association, the  
35 sum of three hundred dollars, to be paid out of  
36 the moiety of the income of the Massachusetts  
37 school fund applicable to educational purposes,  
38 subject to the approval of the state board of edu-  
39 cation. [Pub. Stat., chap. 42, sect. 5.]

(Appropriation 1891, \$300.)

40 For salaries and expenses of the agents of the  
41 state board of education, a sum not exceeding

42 eighteen thousand seven hundred dollars. [Pub.  
43 Stat., chap. 41, sect. 9.]

(Appropriation 1891, \$17,200.)

44 For incidental expenses of the state board of  
45 education, and of the secretary thereof, a sum not  
46 exceeding twelve hundred dollars. [Pub. Stat.,  
47 chap. 41, sect. 10.]

(Appropriation 1891, \$1,200.)

48 For the Dukes county teachers' association, the  
49 sum of fifty dollars. [Acts 1866, chap. 61.]

(Appropriation 1891, \$50.)

50 For aid to pupils in state normal schools, a  
51 sum not exceeding four thousand dollars, payable  
52 in semi-annual instalments, to be expended under  
53 the direction of the state board of education.  
54 [Res. 1876, chap. 47.]

(Appropriation 1891, \$4,000.)

55 For travelling and other necessary expenses of  
56 members of the state board of education, a sum  
57 not exceeding six hundred dollars. [Pub. Stat.,  
58 chap. 41, sect. 10.]

(Appropriation 1891, \$400.)

59 For education of deaf pupils of the Common-  
60 wealth in the school designated by law, a sum  
61 not exceeding thirty-five thousand dollars. [Pub.  
62 Stat., chap. 41, sects. 16 and 17; Acts 1887,  
63 chap. 179.]

(Appropriation 1891, \$32,000.)

64 For expenses in connection with the boarding  
65 houses of the state normal schools, a sum not  
66 exceeding fifty-one hundred dollars. [Acts,  
67 1891, chap. 384.]

(No appropriation, 1891.)

68 To carry out the provisions of the act to pro-  
69 mote the establishment and efficiency of free pub-  
70 lic libraries, a sum not exceeding five thousand  
71 dollars; and for clerical assistance, incidental and  
72 necessary expenses of the board of library com-  
73 missioners, a sum not exceeding five hundred  
74 dollars. [Acts 1890, chap. 347.]

(No appropriation, 1891.)

75 For contingent expenses of the state library,  
76 to be expended under the direction of the trus-  
77 tees and librarian, a sum not exceeding ten hun-  
78 dred dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 5; Res. 1856,  
79 chap. 74.]

(Appropriation 1891, \$1,000.)

80 The income of the Rogers book fund, of the  
81 Todd normal school fund, and of the two educa-  
82 tional funds, shall be expended in accordance  
83 with the provisions of the various acts relating  
84 thereto. [Acts 1850, chap. 63; 1857, chap. 215;  
85 1863, chaps. 166 and 220.]

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
