2 ber 7, 1770 and will celebrate its two hundredth anniversary

7 *Whereas*, Large numbers of its citizens have distinguished

12 of the town is of great significance not only to the inhabitants  
13 of the town but also to the commonwealth at large; therefore

15 *Resolved*, That the Massachusetts House of Representatives  
16 hereby extends to the beautiful and historical town of South-  
17 wick its congratulations and best wishes for a prosperous  
18 future; and be it further

19 *Resolved*, That copies of these resolutions be forwarded by  
20 the Secretary of the Commonwealth to the town clerk of the  
21 town of Southwick to be filed with the records of said town.
