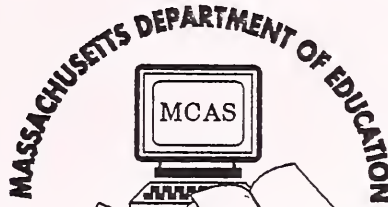

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## Background

Massachusetts public school students in the graduating class of 2003 will be the first class of students required to earn a competency determination as a condition for earning a high school diploma. The Education Reform Law of 1993 mandated the competency determination. In January 2000, the Board of Education established current regulations that require students to attain a performance level of *Needs Improvement* or higher on both the grade 10 English Language Arts and Mathematics tests of the Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System (MCAS) to earn a competency determination. Students have multiple opportunities to retake the test(s) that they did not pass prior to their scheduled graduation date. As of April 2002, students in the class of 2003 have had two opportunities to take the grade 10 MCAS tests in spring 2001 and in fall 2001.

## State Results

The table below shows the percentage of students in the class of 2003 who have now earned a competency determination based on the cumulative number of students who have passed the grade 10 MCAS tests administered in the spring and fall of 2001. The percentage of students in the *original class of 2003* who have earned a competency determination was calculated using enrollment data reported by school principals on the first day of MCAS testing in the spring of 2001. The percentage of students in the *current class of 2003* who have earned a competency determination was calculated using the fall 2001 grade 11 enrollment data reported by districts through the Department's Student Information Management System (SIMS). Changes in enrollment between the spring and fall are due primarily to students transferring, dropping out, or being retained in grade. The Department will track the status of all students in the class of 2003 including those that earn a competency determination, transfers, dropouts, and students retained in grade and provide that information in future reports.

### Description of Original and Current Class of 2003

When examining the performance of the class of 2003, there is no single way to define that class. One option is to define the class as the group of students enrolled at a fixed point in time. In the results shown above, for example, the class of 2003 is defined as those students enrolled in the tenth grade on the first day of MCAS testing in spring 2001.

Another option is to focus on the current class of 2003—that is, to examine the performance of those students currently enrolled in school who are scheduled to graduate in the spring of 2003.

For the purposes of this progress report, the performance of two groups of students is examined. Those two groups are defined in the table below.

Description of Original and Current Class of 2003	
<b>Original Class</b> (68,118)	<i>Students enrolled in the tenth grade on the first day of MCAS testing in the spring of 2001.</i>  This is the set of 68,118 students reported by school principals through the spring 2001 MCAS <i>Student Identification Forms</i> . School principals were required to submit a <i>Student Identification Form</i> for all students enrolled in the tenth grade on the first day of MCAS testing.
<b>Current Class</b> (63,767)	<i>Students enrolled in the class of 2003 at the beginning of the current 2001-2002 school year.</i>  This is the set of 63,767 students reported by school districts as grade 11 students in the fall 2001 collection of individual student data for the Department's Student Information Management System (SIMS). Each fall, all school districts are required to provide the Department with a roster of all students enrolled at each grade level on the first day of October.

### Comparison of the Original and Current Class of 2003

Although the majority of students are the same in both groups, there was a considerable change in the membership of the class of 2003 from the tenth to the eleventh grades. As a starting point, the table above shows that the current class has 4,351 fewer students than original class. That difference is the aggregate of the number of students entering and leaving the class of 2003.

The figure below shows a comparison between the two groups indicates that 96 percent (60,965) of the 63,767 students in the current class, were members of the class of 2003 in the spring of 2001. Among the remaining 2,802 students are students who entered the class of 2003 after the spring of 2001, students who were unaccounted for in the spring of 2001, and students whose records from the fall and spring could not be matched.

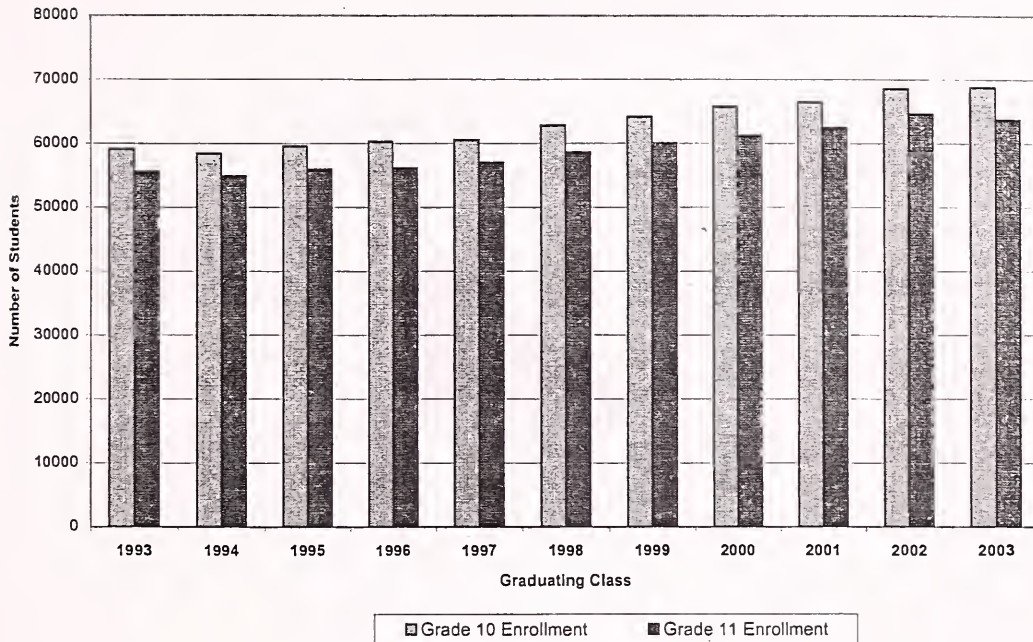


A second issue is to determine what became of the approximately 7,000 students in the original class who are no longer in the current class of 2003. Over half of those students can be linked with current grade 10 or grade 12 SIMS data. The remaining group of students includes students no longer enrolled in public school in Massachusetts: students who moved out of state or to a private school, students who dropped out of school, and students whose records from the MCAS tests could not be matched to students in the current class.

Overall, the drop in enrollment in the class of 2003 from the spring of the tenth grade to the fall of the eleventh grade is consistent with previous school years. The graph below shows the relationship between grade 10 and grade 11 enrollments for the graduating classes from 1993 to 2003.

### Progress of the Current Class of 2003

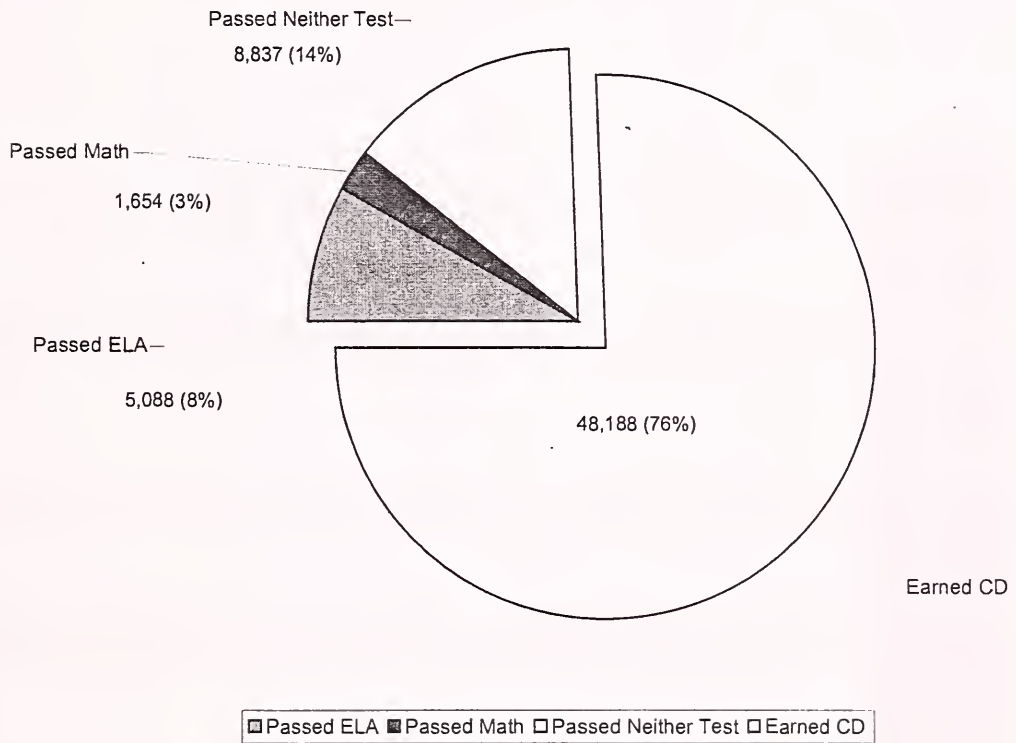
The progress of the current class of 2003 is consistent with the performance of the original class. Approximately three-fourths (76 percent) of the 63,767 students who were enrolled in the class of 2003 at the beginning of the 2001-2002 school year have earned a competency determination. This includes students who participated in the MCAS tests in the spring of 2000, the spring of 2001, and the fall 2001 retest.

The figure below presents a closer look at the students who have not yet earned a competency determination. Similar to the original class, slightly more than half of those students have passed neither the ELA nor Mathematics MCAS test. However, it is likely that this number is somewhat inflated because it includes approximately 2,800 students whose MCAS and SIMS records could not be matched. Of the remaining students who have passed one of the MCAS tests, more than three times as many have passed the English Language Arts test (5,088) as the Mathematics test (1,654).
