AN ACT PROHIBITING THE MANUFACTURE OR SALE OF ANY TENTS  
MADE OF INFLAMMABLE MATERIAL.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 148 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting after section 25B the following section:—
- 3 *Section 25C.* No person shall manufacture or sell any tent
- 4 made of inflammable material. Whoever violates any provision
- 5 of this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than one
- 6 hundred dollars.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Congress  
 Great assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Chapter 116 of the Statutes at Large is hereby amended by  
 inserting after section 201 the following section:

2. Section 202. No person shall manufacture or sell any iron  
 or steel of inferior quality. Whoever violates any provision  
 of this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than  
 one thousand dollars.
