

Chap. 27. RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL RELATIVE TO CERTAIN RIGHTS OF THE UNEMPLOYED, ELDERLY AND ILLEGITIMATE CHILDREN.

Resolved, That the judicial council be requested to make an investigation of the subject matter of current senate document numbered 928, relative to the rights of children born out of wedlock, and of current house documents numbered 62, establishing a civil paternity action and prohibiting discrimination against children born out of wedlock; 1520, providing for the appointment of conservators for certain elderly persons; 1940, providing for public conservators; 2726, deleting the term "illegitimacy" from certain statutes; 3154, clarifying the law respecting tenancies of two or more in personal property; 4449, amending the laws pertaining to certain children; and 5647, prohibiting mortgage foreclosures against certain unemployed persons, and to include its conclusions and its recommendations, if any, in relation thereto, together with drafts of such legislation as may be necessary to give effect to the same, in its annual report for the current year.

Chap. 28. RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL RELATIVE TO REPEALING AN AUTHORIZATION OF CREDIT COUNSELING CORPORATION TO ENGAGE IN THE PRACTICE OF LAW.

Resolved, That the judicial council be requested to make an investigation of the subject matter of current house document numbered 1153, relative to repealing an authorization of credit counseling corporation to engage in the practice of law, and to include its conclusions and its recommendations, if any, in relation thereto, together with drafts of such legislation as may be necessary to give effect to the same, in its annual report for the current year.

Chap. 29. RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO MAKE AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY RELATIVE TO THE PRICING AND MARKETING PROCEDURES OF GROCERY STORE CHAINS IN THE COMMONWEALTH.
