AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PROHIBITION OF ADVERTISING ON THE PART OF PUBLIC UTILITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 25 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding
- 2 the following new section 13:—
- 3 *Section 13.* The commission shall prohibit any form of ad-
- 4 vertising by any public utility which enjoys a monopoly within
- 5 the commonwealth.
