AN ACT REGULATING SELECTION OF SITES FOR NEW STATE COLLEGES AND ACQUIRING LAND FOR EXISTING STATE COLLEGES.

1 *Whereas*, the deferred operation of this act would tend to
2 defeat its purpose, which is to provide forthwith that certain
3 administrative changes be made in the administration of the
4 State Colleges, therefore, it is hereby declared to be an emer-
5 gency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the
6 public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The first paragraph of section 1 of chapter 73 of the General
2 Laws, as most recently amended by section 7 and 8 of chapter
3 561 of the acts of 1964, is hereby further amended by inserting
4 after the first sentence, the following two sentences:— Subject
5 to the approval of the governor and council said board of trustees
6 of state colleges shall establish, continue or expand state colleges
7 at suitable locations selected by said board in accordance with
8 the provisions of this chapter. For such purposes said Board
9 shall have the power to construct, lease, alter or otherwise pro-
10 vide any facilities required for said colleges including the right
11 to purchase or to take by eminent domain under the provisions
12 of chapter seventy-nine land and buildings.
