Chap. 43. RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING PENALTIES FOR THE CRIME OF OBSTRUCTION OF JUSTICE.

Resolved, That the judicial council be requested to investigate the subject matter of current house document numbered 6169, relative to establishing penalties for the crime of obstruction of justice, and to include its conclusions and its recommendations, if any, in relation thereto, together with drafts of such legislation as may be necessary to give effect to the same, in its annual report for the current year.

Chap. 44. RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR A COST ESTIMATE BY THE RETIREMENT LAW COMMISSION OF CERTAIN PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE PUBLIC EMPLOYEE RETIREMENT LAW.

Resolved, That the retirement law commission shall determine the estimated cost of the subject matter of the current senate document numbered 1151, increasing the cost-of-living adjustments for retired public employees; and of current house documents numbered 675, increasing the cost-of-living adjustments for retired public employees; 980, providing for ordinary disability retirement eligibility after ten years of creditable service; 1576, establishing the veteran's retirement act of nineteen hundred and seventy-five; 1987, providing for ordinary disability retirement eligibility after ten years of creditable service; 2604, relative to the computation of the retirement allowances for certain persons in the public service; and 4292, relative to the cost-of-living increase for retired persons.
