AN ACT GRANTING HOUSING AUTHORITIES ADMINISTRATIVE UP-FRONT FUNDING FOR CHAPTER 705 HOUSING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 121B of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 creating a new section . . . Section 60.
- 3 Housing authorities which are duly organized and existing
- 4 under and pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws (Ter. ed.)
- 5 Chapter 121.B as amended, as inserted by Chapter 751 of the
- 6 Acts of 1969, and County Regional Housing Authorities pur-
- 7 suant to Chapter 419 of the Acts of 1976 and other similar
- 8 statutes which receive funding for housing under Chapter 705
- 9 of the Acts of 1966, shall be permitted to spend no more than
- 10 nine (9%) percent of a total grant on administration.
- 11 Said funding for administration shall be available from the
- 12 date grant contracts are finalized.

The General Assembly of the State

is the body which exercises the legislative power of the State.

It is composed of the Senate and the House of Representatives.

The Senate is composed of twenty members.

1. The members of the Senate shall be elected by the people of the State.

2. The members of the Senate shall hold office for two years.

3. The members of the Senate shall be elected in the same manner as the members of the House of Representatives.

4. The members of the Senate shall be elected in the same manner as the members of the House of Representatives.
