AN ACT RELATIVE TO PAYMENTS FOR CERTAIN INJURIES INCURRED
BY EMPLOYEES OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 58 of chapter 30 of the General Laws, as amended by
2 chapter 602 of the acts of 1955, is hereby amended by striking
3 out the last paragraph and inserting in place thereof the fol-
4 lowing:—

5 Notwithstanding the provisions of this section an employee
6 while in the performance of duties receives bodily injuries re-
7 sulting from acts of violence of patients or prisoners in his
8 custody as determined by the appointing authority shall be
9 paid his regular salary during any period of absence resulting
10 from such injuries. If such employee is entitled to benefits
11 under the provisions of chapter one hundred and fifty-two of
12 the General Laws, such benefits shall be returned to the agency
13 where he is employed. No payment made under the provisions
14 of this section shall reduce in any way or be charged against
15 available sick leave credits even if such absence may be for less
16 than six days.
