## **The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ASSISTANT REGISTERS OF PROBATE BY THE REGISTER OF PROBATE WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE JUDGES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 23 of chapter 217 of the General Laws,  
2 as appearing in the 1984 Official Edition, is hereby amended by  
3 striking out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the  
4 following sentence: — The register of the probate and family court  
5 department for each county may appoint, with the approval of  
6 the judges of such court, for a term of three years from the date  
7 of their appointment, and may remove, with the approval of said  
8 judges, a first assistant register of probate.

1 SECTION 2. Section 23A of said chapter 217 as so appearing,  
2 is hereby amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting  
3 in place thereof the following sentence: — In addition to the first  
4 assistant registers of probate provided for in section twenty-three,  
5 the registers of probate of the respective divisions of the probate  
6 and family court department, with the approval of the judges of  
7 such division, may appoint assistant registers with the same  
8 powers and duties for the following counties.

AN ACT TO AMEND THE ACTS RELATIVE TO THE REGISTRATION OF VOTERS AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGISTRATION OF VOTERS IN THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA.

THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

DO HEREBY CERTIFY THAT THE FOREGOING IS A TRUE AND CORRECT COPY OF THE ACT AS PASSED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and the seal of the District of Columbia, this 1st day of January, 1901.

COMMISSIONER OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

SECTION 1. Section 117 of the District Code, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows: "The Board of Commissioners of the District of Columbia shall have the honor to certify to the several courts and officers of the District of Columbia the names of the persons who are entitled to vote in the District of Columbia, and to issue to each voter a certificate of registration, which shall be valid for a term of three years from the date of such issue, and may be renewed by the voter at any time before the expiration of such term."

SECTION 2. Section 118 of the District Code, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows: "The Board of Commissioners of the District of Columbia shall have the honor to certify to the several courts and officers of the District of Columbia the names of the persons who are entitled to vote in the District of Columbia, and to issue to each voter a certificate of registration, which shall be valid for a term of three years from the date of such issue, and may be renewed by the voter at any time before the expiration of such term."
