AN ACT RELATIVE TO INCREASING THE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE OF SCHOOL JANITORS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by striking out section 45A, as inserted by chapter 708 of the
3 acts of 1945, and inserting in place thereof the following sec-
4 tion:—

5 *Section 45A.* In any city or town to which section forty-four
6 applies and which accepts the section [in the manner set forth
7 in section forty-five] the pension payable to a person retired
8 under section forty-four shall be [one half] **two thirds** of the
9 highest salary or other compensation received by him while he
10 was holding the grade held by him at his retirement.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect in a city upon acceptance
2 by the city council and in a town by acceptance at a town
3 meeting.

THE CONSTITUTIONALITY OF SEPARATIONS

IN THE YEAR OF THE LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE SEPARATION OF THE SEVERAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE GOVERNMENT

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, February 27, 1907.

1. That the several departments of the Government shall be separated and the functions of each department shall be defined as follows:

2. The Executive Department shall be the department of the Government which shall be charged with the execution of the laws of the United States and with the management of the Government.

3. The Legislative Department shall be the department of the Government which shall be charged with the making of laws for the United States and with the control of the Executive Department.
