AN ACT PROHIBITING THE OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES WITH CERTAIN TINTED GLASS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting  
2 after section 13 the following section: —

3 *Section 13A.* No person shall operate a vehicle which has glass  
4 windows or windshields which are more than twenty-five per cent  
5 tinted, or which vehicle has such windows or windshields that  
6 prevents seeing the vehicle from the outside. Any dealer of motor  
7 vehicles who sell a vehicle equipped with glass in violation of the  
8 provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than  
9 five hundred nor more than one thousand dollars or by imprison-  
10 ment of not less than thirty nor more than sixty days in a house of  
11 correction.
