### AN ACT AUTHORIZING SCHOOL COMMITTEES TO EMPLOY CERTAIN RETIRED TEACHERS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special  
2 law to the contrary, a school committee is hereby authorized  
3 to employ any teacher over the age of seventy, when, in its  
4 judgment, such employment would be beneficial to the school  
5 system such teacher would serve.

It is the duty of the House of Representatives to see that the laws are faithfully executed and that the executive branch of the Government is properly controlled.

1. The Commission on the General Land Office was organized on July 1, 1906, and has since that time been engaged in a study of the various questions connected with the management of the public lands.
2. The Commission has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from the public.
3. The Commission has also conducted extensive investigations into the various problems connected with the management of the public lands.
4. The Commission has prepared this report in order to present to the Senate a summary of its findings and recommendations.
5. The Commission believes that the recommendations herein set forth will result in a more efficient and economical management of the public lands.
