AN ACT ALLOWING CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS TO PROVIDE HOMEMAKER SERVICES TO A FAMILY MEMBER.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Clause C of section four of chapter nineteen A of
2 the General Laws, as most recently amended by section sixty-three
3 of chapter three hundred ninety-three of the acts of nineteen-
4 hundred and seventy-nine, is hereby further amended by adding at
5 the end thereof the following: — the secretary is further directed to
6 establish a program under which an individual who provides
7 homemaker or personal care services as defined above to a
8 member of his or her family, age seventy and over, or age sixty or
9 over if the person in need of services has been determined to be
10 suffering from Alzheimer's Disease, shall receive from a homecare
11 program in the area in which said individual resides a sum equal to
12 the amount paid by said home care program for similar services.
